## ***“Continuing to Care and Connect to Country”***

### **About the job**

The Gunditj Mirring Traditional Owners Aboriginal Corporation (GMTOAC) pays respect, acknowledges, and honours Gunditjmarara Ancestors and Elders who have provided a Dharn (pathway) from the past, to the present and into the future. We continue the right to care and protect our Country based on the Gunditjmarara community principles.

For the Gunditjmarara, Country encapsulates people, plants, and animals alike. It embraces the seasons, stories, and spirits of the Creation. This flowing connected cultural landscape possesses sacred places, proud languages, vibrant ceremonies, strong totems, ancient art, unique clan groupings, and law and lore. Gunditjmarara spirit is in this Country, from Tungatt (the stones), entwined in Woorowarook (forests), along Bocara (Glenelg River) to the roaring Nyamat (sea).

The Gunditj Mirring Traditional Owners Community established the Gunditj Mirring Traditional Owners Aboriginal Corporation RNTBC (GMTOAC) in 2005 to continue our connection to Gunditjmarara country and to progress our rights and interests in our cultural identity, social justice, native title, cultural heritage and land justice for our Gunditjmarara Country.

GMTOAC is seeking a new **Chief Executive Officer** (CEO) to work with the Board of Directors to provide the opportunities that will enhance the ability of Gunditjmarara people to celebrate their community, culture and connect to Country. The CEO will also enhance the visibility and opportunity to collaborate with organisations on key projects and represent GMTOAC in the planning processes.

Supported by an experienced executive team, the CEO will work closely with the leadership of the company’s shareholder groups to promote a culture of collaboration, innovation and excellence, enhancing GMTOAC’s landscape and cementing its reputation. Candidates will require highly developed communication and stakeholder engagement skills, with the ability to navigate complexity with influence and gravitas.



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This is an identified position, and successful applicants must be able to provide evidence that they have worked with, managed and supported aboriginal and/ or Torres Straight Islander people; and understand the historic and current issues affecting Gunditjmarra people and country; as well as the broader Indigenous Aboriginal and Torres Islander Community.

This is an exciting time within GMTOAC and the CEO will play a pivotal role in shaping GMTOAC's future success.
